Why does the Census Matter?

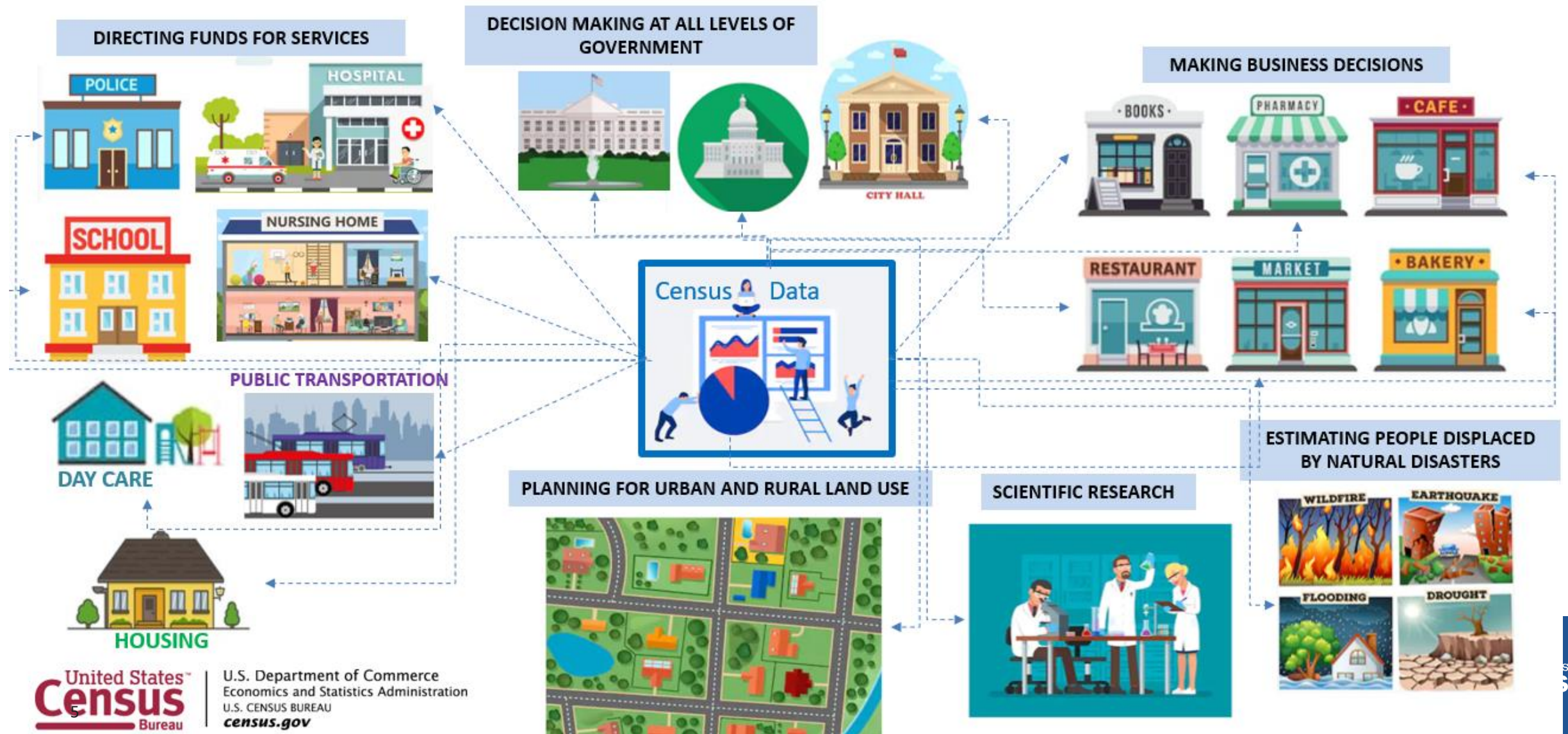
Power

- State Redistricting of legislative boundaries

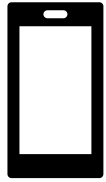
Money

April 20-27	A final reminder postcard before we follow up in person.

We understand you might miss our initial letter in the mail.

- Every household that hasn't already responded will receive reminders and will eventually receive a paper questionnaire.
- It doesn't matter which initial invitation you get or how you get it—we will follow up in person with all households that don't respond.

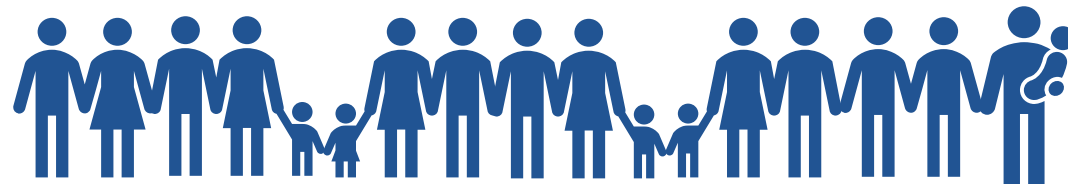
Your Answers are Protected by Law

Title 13 of the U.S. Code

- The Census is Confidential and required by Law
- Results of the Census are reported in Statistical format only
- We do not share respondent personal information or responses with any other government agencies
- All Census Employees swear to a lifetime oath to protect respondent information
- Penalties for wrongful disclosure - Up to 5 years imprisonment and or a fine of \$250,000

Job Qualifications

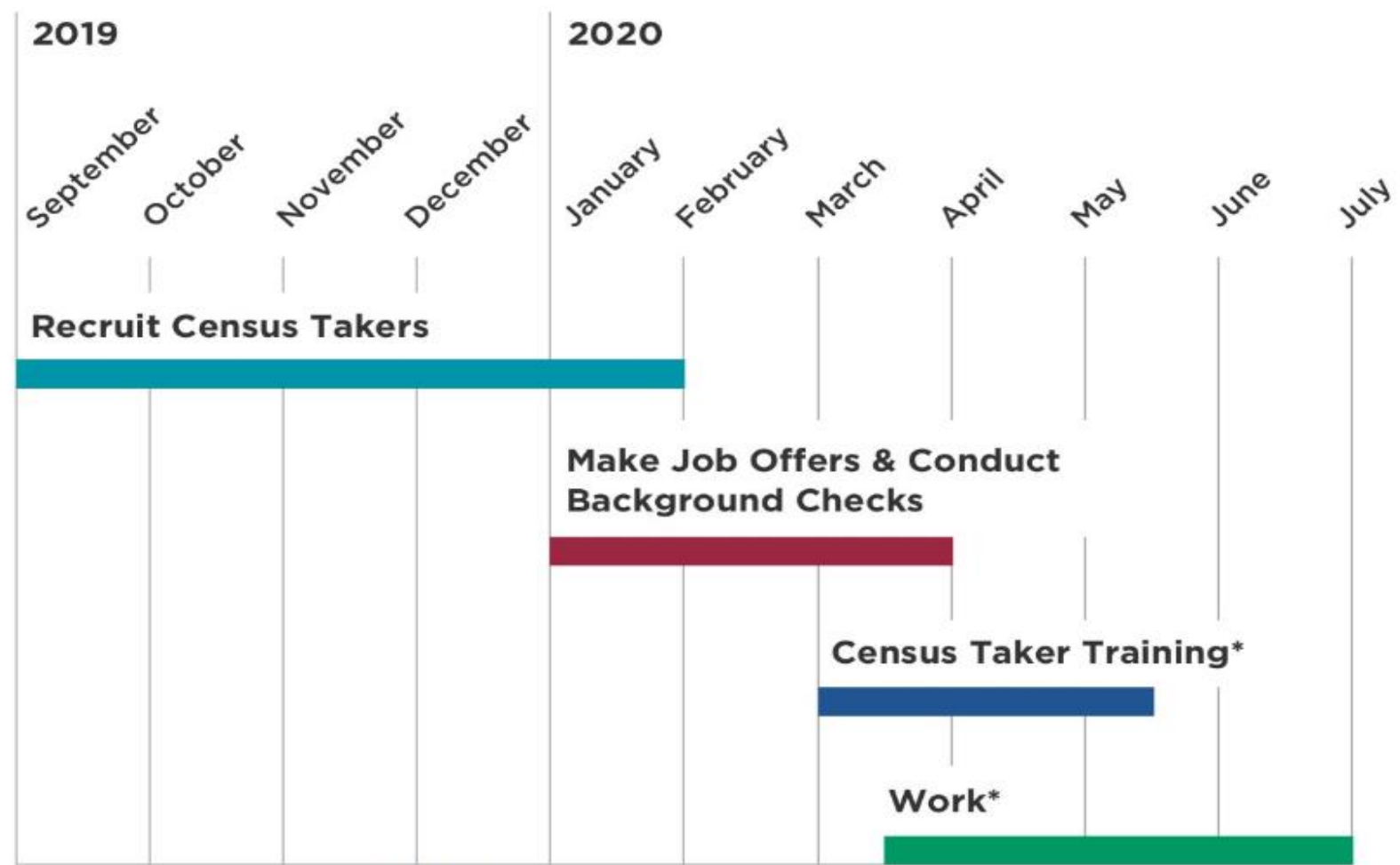
- Be at least 18 years old.
- Have a valid Social Security number.
- Be a U.S. citizen.
- Have a valid email address.
- Complete an application and answer assessment questions. (Some assessment questions are available in Spanish. However, an English proficiency test may also be required.)
- Be registered with the Selective Service System or have a qualifying exemption, if you are a male born after Dec. 31, 1959.
- Pass a Census-performed criminal background check and a review of criminal records, including fingerprinting.
- Commit to completing training.
- Be available to work flexible hours, which can include days, evenings, and/or weekends.
- **Most jobs require employees to:**
 - Have access to a vehicle and a valid driver's license, unless public transportation is readily available.
 - Have access to a computer with internet and an email account (to complete training).
 - If you are employed elsewhere, your current job must be compatible with Census Bureau employment and not create conflicts of interest. These will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Also, you must not engage in any partisan political activity while on duty.

What to Expect

Most 2020 Census positions will likely last several weeks. These temporary positions can include census takers, recruiting assistants, office staff, and supervisory staff. They feature:

- ✓ Competitive wages
- ✓ Weekly paychecks
- ✓ Flexible hours
- ✓ Paid training

Some positions require evening and/or weekend shifts because you must be available to interview members of the public when they are at home.

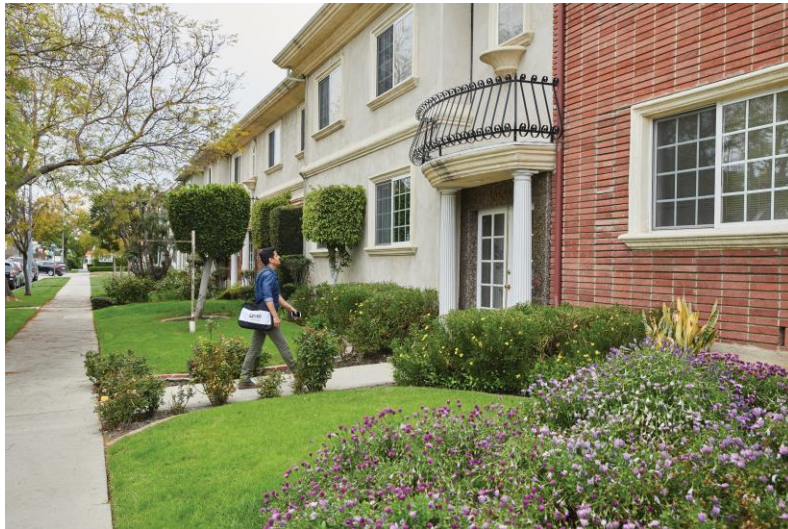

3 Steps for a Successful Application



Step 1: Create a Profile

✓Passwords: cannot be the same as email; must contain both upper and lower-case letters, contain alpha and numeric characters; cannot have three or more consecutive same letters or numbers.

✓Confirm password: Reenter the same password from the first line.

✓If the password does not match, then correct the passwords by entering them again.

✓Read the: "Terms of Service" agreement and check the box.

✓Tap: "Create Profile".

✓Check the email account used in the: "Create a Profile" screen to validate.

✓Enter zip code to complete registration.

Create a Profile

All fields marked * are required.

- Passwords cannot have leading or trailing spaces
- Passwords cannot be the same as email.
- Passwords must contain both upper and lower case letters
- Passwords must contain alpha and numeric characters
- Passwords cannot have three or more consecutive same characters
- Passwords must contain at least one special character
- Passwords must be 12 - 20 characters

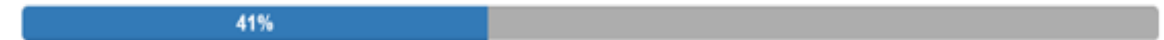

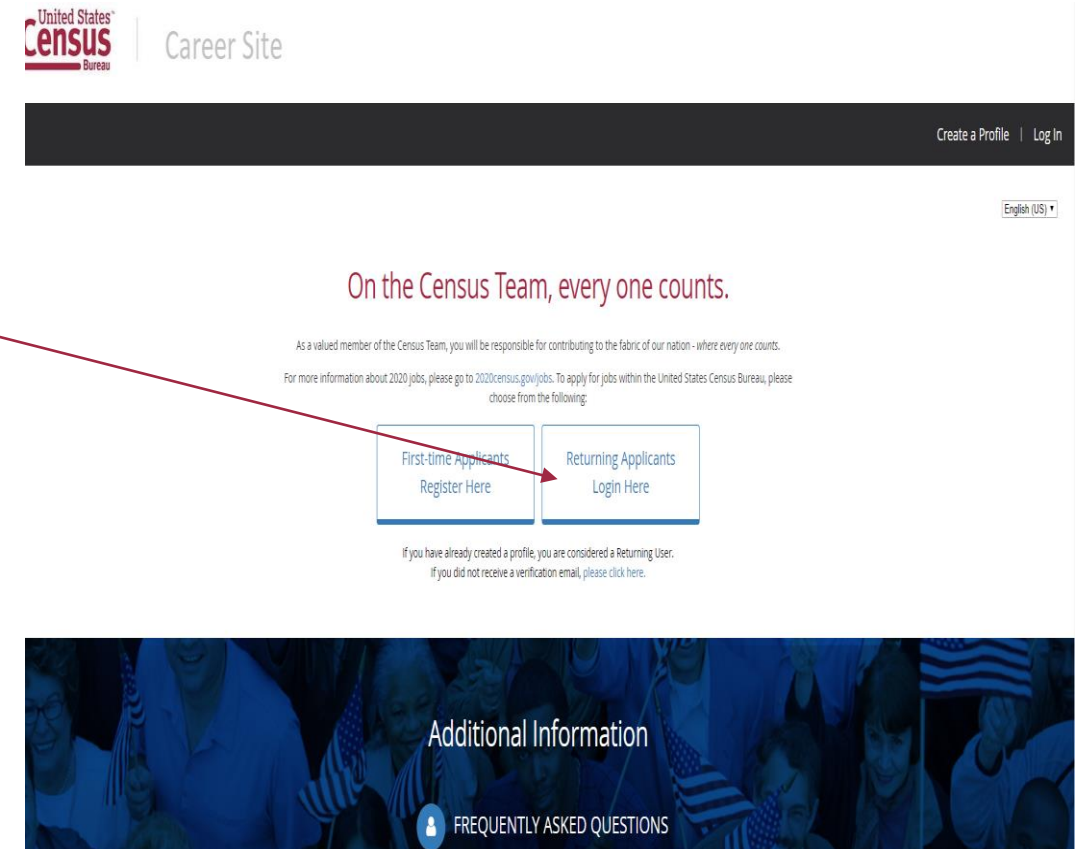
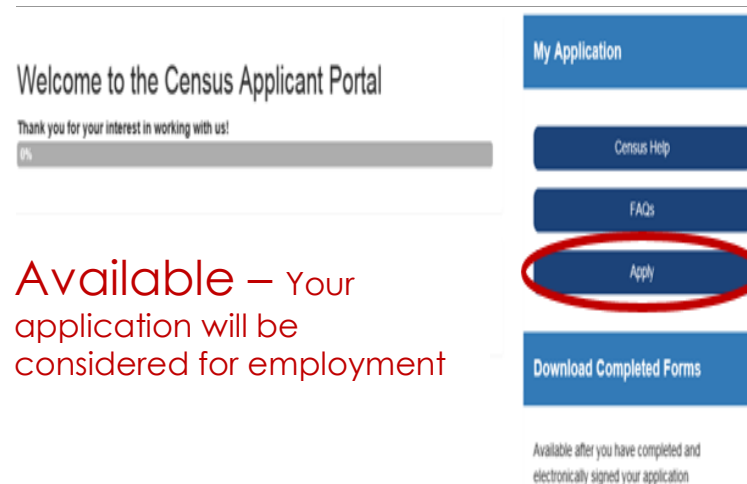
